Let us imagine that once a man suggested to the people that they erect a large, magnificent building. The multi-million dollar project was to be ten stories high.

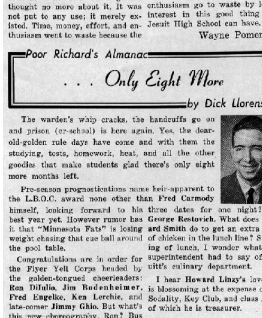

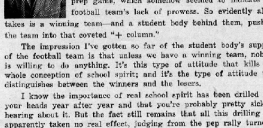

Wingtip's Terry Bryant made good for the rest of the type touchdown in the Woodlawn game.



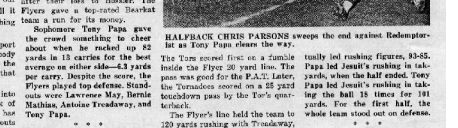

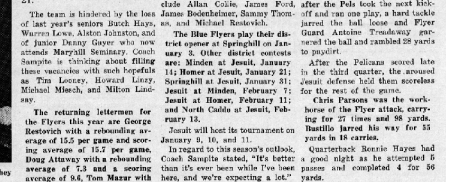
HALFBACK CHRIS PARSONS sweeps the end against Redemptorist as Tony Papa chases the play.

The Flyers turned two Pellam faced state games during the 1952 season. The Boys-Blue squad scored more points during the 1952 season.

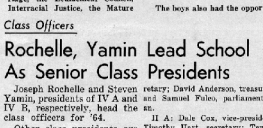

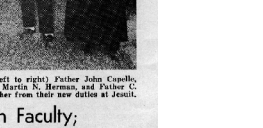

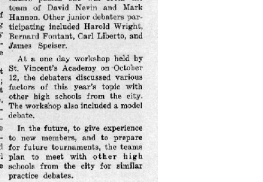
