The group will meet twice a month, and films on various phases of medicine will be shown at each meeting.

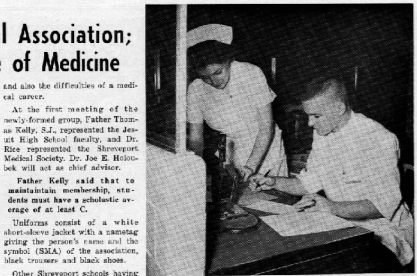

New Key Club Candidates Are Selected; Clubbers To Assist in Heart Fund Drive

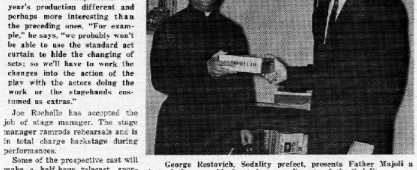
